**Justice Dept. Veteran
Said to Take Over Fraud Section**

Longtime Justice Department official Sandra Moser will reportedly run the DOJ's fraud section while current leader Andrew Weissmann joins special counsel Robert Mueller's probe into possible collusion between the Trump campaign and Russia.

Moser will serve as acting chief until a permanent replacement is named, according to a Bloomberg News report.

As part of her responsibilities, Moser, an 11-year veteran of the Justice Department, will oversee ongoing foreign bribery investigations. The fraud section is currently weighing whether to make permanent a pilot program that offers companies incentives to self-report

possible violations of the Foreign Corrupt Practices Act, an initiative started by Weissmann.

Moser joined the fraud section in 2013 after working as an assistant U.S. attorney in New Jersey, where she was part of a team that charged 44 individuals in a federal investigation of public corruption and money laundering. She also prosecuted musician Lauryn Hill for tax fraud of \$1.8 million in income.

Earlier this year, Moser helped prosecute Takata Corp., one of the world's largest suppliers of automotive safety-related equipment, for selling faulty airbags, which led to a guilty plea to wire fraud and \$1 billion in criminal penalties.
